

Anfield Road Primary School PE Premium 2015-2016

The Government is providing funding of £150 million per annum to provide new, substantial primary school sport funding. This funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary school Head teachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children.

The sport funding can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools. OFSTED will play a significant role in ensuring that schools target this funding in areas which will lead to clear outcomes in raising standards and opportunities in PE and school sport for all children throughout the Primary Phase. All schools will receive a lump sum of £8,000 plus a premium of £5 per pupil for the next two academic years.

For the academic year **2015/16** Anfield Road Primary received **£10,675.00** PE and Sports grant. This was made up of the £8000 lump sum plus £5 each for the pupils in Year 1 to Year 6 (January 2015 census).

Purpose of Funding

Schools will have to spend the funding on improving their provision of PE and school sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

<p>Hire qualified sports coaches to work alongside teachers when teaching PE</p> <p>We will continue to organise for specialist coaches to come into school, provided by links with NLA our local feeder secondary school and Liverpool FC foundation. Our teachers will observe and participate in the sessions to develop their own skills so that they can then teach this area themselves, once the coach has completed their course of teaching.</p> <p>We will pay for an external provider to train staff with their classes with either a whole school approach to a particular area or tailoring the training to individual teachers' needs.</p> <p>Not only will the children benefit from being taught by a specialist coach but our own staff will be developed through sharing good practice and assisting in the PE lessons.</p>	£3000	LFC coaches taught across many year groups delivering high quality PE based around the delivery of skills.

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<p>Provide places for pupils in after school sports clubs;</p> <p>Our school already offers a range of after school clubs, accessed by children from Key Stages 1 and 2.</p> <p>These clubs will continue to run as before. We aim to provide clubs for Football, Judo, Dance, Rugby, Multi-skills and LFC football coaching. Some clubs will run throughout the year however others will run at various times of the year. Most clubs will continue to be provided free of charge however there may be a small fee charged by coaches for some of the clubs.</p> <p>Coaches will be used to prepare children for tournaments and performances, offering specialist training to support 'Team Anfield Road Primary School'.</p>	<p>No Cost</p>	<p>A variety of afterschool clubs on offer across the year and for different age ranges.</p>
<p>Provide opportunities for children to compete</p> <p>Our PE & Sport Co-ordinator will arrange tournaments and fixtures between the cluster primaries, whilst offering exit routes for our more gifted children, allowing them to compete against other children at a higher level. Anfield Road Primary School pupils have represented the town and city teams, we feel it is important that children who are more able in sport are given the chance to participate against others of a similar ability and potential.</p>	<p>£1000.00</p>	<p>Mini league continues on a regular basis with year 5 and 6 children competing against local schools</p>
